# **Procedure Following Blood/Body Fluid Exposure**

Report the exposure immediately as you may need immediate attention.

If you are exposed to blood or body fluids by a needlestick, cut, bite or splash to a mucous membrane surface (such as eyes, nose or mouth) or contact with non-intact skin, do the following:

- **Punctures:** Wash the affected area well with soap and water for 15 minutes.
- Splash to eyes, nose or mouth: Flush affected area in eye wash for 15 minutes.
- Notify your supervisor if available.
- Contact the appropriate facility as listed above depending on your area of campus.
- Seek medical evaluation immediately (within one hour)
- Following the medical evaluation, your supervisor must complete the Online First Report of Injury Form.
